Most importantly, it is necessary to support your comments with concrete examples and suggestions. It is difficult to understand comments like "this is unclear" or "this is badly organized". Instead, write comments like "this is unclear because there is no specific example" or "it'll be better organized if you move this to the conclusion". You need to help your partners understand the problems and how they can make them better. The more specific your comments are, the more helpful they are.

W: Some experts say that all digital users are now at risk of identity theft. You might not think this is a serious problem, but the truth is nobody's information is safe. There are a number of ways stolen data are put to bad use. If it only produces an increase in spam mail, that's not too bad. But it can be much worse. Your ID number could be used to commit a serious crime. We're also partly responsible when this happens. To protect ourselves, we need to change passwords frequently and check websites before we join them. Otherwise, we're more likely to expose our personal information, and it may be used for illegal purposes.

Actually it varies from two to six meters tall. As an economically important seed plant, it is the world's largest crop by production quantity. Today, Brazil is famous as the largest producer in the world. The Persians discovered sugarcane in India between the 6th and 4th centuries BC and adopted and spread sugarcane agriculture. By the 18th century, people across the world, including the Caribbean, South America, Indian Ocean and Pacific island nations, began their own sugarcane plantations. Let's check what happened because of these increasing numbers of sugarcane plantations in the next slide.
