W: Hello, listeners. This is *One Minute Business Tip*. Do you often use emoticons in your work emails? If yes, you might consider the following research findings. Recent research shows that if you put emoticons in work emails, people might think you're not up to your work. Researchers asked 549 people from 29 countries for their reaction to emoticons. The people were asked to judge the competence and warmth of the email writer. The findings provide evidence that, contrary to actual smiles, smiley emoticons do not increase perceptions of warmth. Furthermore, they actually decrease perceptions of competence. So why don't you keep this research in mind the next time you write a work email?

M: Hello, everyone. We all know that being able to speak several languages can increase your chances of getting a good job. But in addition to that, speaking more than one language has other benefits. Today we'll look at a few of those benefits. First, speaking another language can provide a big boost in creativity. When we express one thought in various ways, like we do when speaking another language, we develop our creativity. People who speak additional languages are also better able to pick up on small differences. By better recognizing these differences, speakers of several languages can improve their decision-making ability. Also, they develop better memory. Just think about all of the memorization practice that comes from learning a new language's grammar and vocabulary. Finally, speakers of multiple languages enhance their concentration by blocking out distracting thoughts and noise. Now, let's take a look at these benefits in more detail.
